Dear Friends of The Collegiate Path,

Happy New Year and welcome to our inaugural TCP Newsletter! We have lots of news to share....

2023 was a momentous year for us, as we expanded our little team to better meet the needs of our students and families—welcoming Puja, Thejaswini, and Mrudula to our fold!

Over the past year, we introduced several new initiatives, including our:

Writing and Study Skills Center: Many of you have met Puja, who runs our Center, supporting students to achieve their best academically, including transforming them into better writers. Several of her mentees have had remarkable turnarounds in their academic performance.

Master Classes: We tested group sessions targeting specific steps of the application process, writing skills, and other information to be shared widely across our mentees. The positive feedback has pushed us to expand the Master Class schedule for the coming year. Look out for your 2024 Master Class schedule headed soon to your inbox!

Applicant Cohort: After fielding several requests to connect our mentees with one another, we created our Essay Boot Camp to get them working together. We plan to build on this through our Master Classes and Workshops this year.

International education

"Adjusting to the American educational system was quite challenging at first. I didn't fully realize that every little thing counts towards your grades. Additionally, being an international student comes with its own set of realities. It's neither good nor bad, yet it does make you different from your American peers. When it comes to the best part of studying abroad, I think it's the fact that you get to meet a lot of people. I found my own community here by dabbling in every opportunity my college had to offer."

"I think the best part and the hardest part of my study abroad experience are probably related. Studying at UChicago genuinely brought me out of my comfort zone, but it was a major transition. The hardest part, I think, is the more individualistic approach here compared to the community-based environment in India. Having said that, once I settled in, I did have a lot of fun. And, I think this experience has made me a more confident person."

"Honestly, despite my own research, I found myself overwhelmed by the amount of information on U.S. college applications. Meghna did an excellent job in methodically explaining it all to me. So, I think I went from a 2 or 2.5 to a full 5 on a 5-point scale in terms of my readiness or preparedness for college. Not just that, Meghna also guided me through what to expect living in the United States, went over certain nuances like the tipping culture and things to be mindful of, and helped me understand how to make responsible and informed decisions."

"Working with Meghna and Amanda really helped me reflect on my sense of purpose. They don't just help with applications; they also encourage you to learn more about yourself. I believe they are the perfect combination of individuals who are amazing at what they do and are also amazingly kind. I have nothing but good things to say about them."

Parting Advice for this year's Applicants

"I think the main focus should be on immersing yourself in your college environment; there's so much that it has to offer, and I highly recommend joining different clubs and participating in activities. Doing so can help in managing any initial negative feelings or homesickness. In my experience, I am extremely grateful for having done this, as it helped me find a community of my own."

"I think it'd be good to reflect on why you do things. And, yeah, things can get competitive, but it's important to stay focused. And if you need someone to talk to, you can reach out to me through Amanda or Meghna."


Looking Forward

Meghna: The End of Adolescence: The Lost Art of Delaying Adulthood by Nancy E. Hill & Alexis Redding argues that the role of college as a bridge to adulthood remains very much needed today. The typical "w-curve"—from the high of the initial honeymoon to the dip of culture shock, then back up with initial adjustment and down again due to homesickness, to the final upswing toward connectedness—remains the same now as it was for college students in the 1970s.



Amanda: The Moonstone by Wilkie Collins is an approachable 19th century novel. Considered the first detective novel ever, it inspired the Sherlock Holmes series. It is an epistolary tale, told in a series of accounts by the different suspects, and in a perspective sympathetic to India.



Puja: Before I Fall by Lauren Oliver is a Y/A novel that explores self-reflection, empathy, the consequences of actions, and the power of second chances. The recurring experiences of the main character, Samantha, provide a thought-provoking exploration of adolescent life, highlighting how the smallest decisions can have extensive consequences.




MENTEES' BOOK BUZZ
